

Iraq Memorial Wall

A photo history of the Cost of the Iraq War in Coalition Soldiers' Lives

Instructions for downloading and printing files

The Iraq Memorial Wall was created by Wayne Coste, of Tarriffville, CT. Using info on websites of CNN, Army Times, and others, he has created a photo display of all the Coalition soldiers killed in Iraq since March 2003. For each soldier, the list provides name, age, military unit, hometown, and cause of death. Wayne has used the printed color sheets to create a portable wall in 4' x 8' sections, which can be transported in the back of a van and displayed at peace demonstrations and other events.

The pages can also be printed and placed in a 3-ring binder for display tables. When formatted for 2 pages to a sheet, there are more than 160 single-sided sheets, or slightly more than 80 double-sided sheets. The original document contains color photos, but also prints well on black-and-white laser printers.

The list has been updated through September 9, 2005, (in preparation for 9/11 memorial events) and consolidated into two zip files which can be downloaded. There are two alphabetically arranged files. The first file includes soldiers who died during the period from the start of the war through July 26th, 2004 (17 months) and the second file starts there and is updated through September 9, 2005 (14 months).

To print the files 2 pages to a sheet, using Word 2000:

1. Select Print from the File Menu.
2. Use the "Zoom" portion of the Print dialogue box (lower right) to specify 2 pages per sheet and scale the printout to letter size.
3. Print, and the document will print out with 12 soldiers per sheet.
4. You may also want to select double-sided printing, if your printer has that feature.
